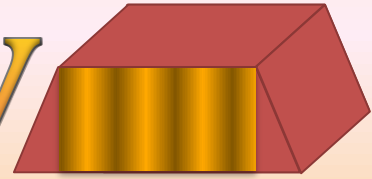
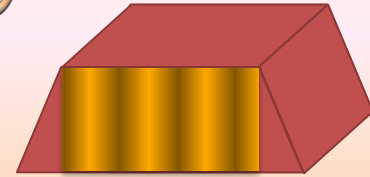


Do We Glorify the Lord?



Leviticus 10:1-7

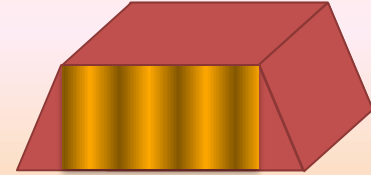
The Lord God is Holy



- **Lesson from Leviticus:**

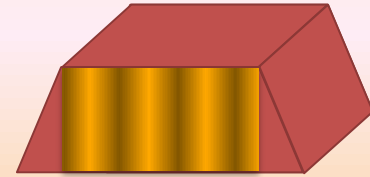
- The Lord God is holy. ***Leviticus 11:44; 19:2; 20:7***
- Holy, holy, holy is the Lord. ***Isa 6:1-3; Rev 4:8-11***
- God is to be recognized as Holy and always glorified before His people. ***Cf. Psalms 89:7***

The Sin of Nadab and Abihu



- **Nadab and Abihu sinned.**
 - Used a fire not commanded by the Lord.
Lev 10:1-3; 16:12-13
 - They did not regard God as holy.
 - They did not glorify God before the people.

The Sin of Nadab and Abihu

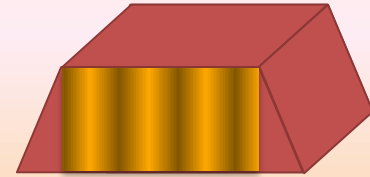


- **Moses was guilty of the same.**

Num 20:12; Deut 32:51

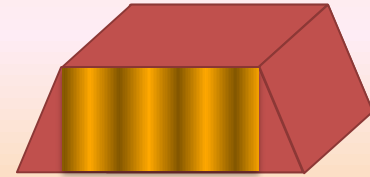
- Did not regard the Lord as holy
- Did not glorify the Lord before the people.

Glorifying the Lord



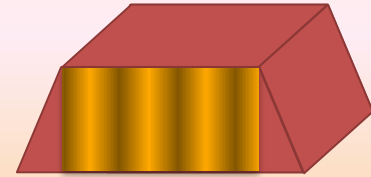
- **Regarding God as holy yields obedience.**
 - Our attitude leads to obedience.
Cf. Psalms 89:7
 - Serve Him with reverence and godly fear.
Heb 12:28
 - We will faithfully obey His commands.
Matt 7:21

Glorifying the Lord



- **Through our obedience the Lord is glorified.**
 - Jesus glorified the Father. ***John 13:31-32***
 - When people see our good works, they glorify the Lord. ***Matt 5:13-16***
 - Consider the following passages: ***2 Thess 3:1; 1 Peter 4:11; 2 Thess 1:9-12***

- **Nadab and Abihu did not regard the Lord as holy and did not glorify the Lord.**
- **Let us always regard the Lord as holy.**
- **Let our actions always glorify the Lord.**
